# **Board of Directors Meeting**

March 20, 2019



<u>Plant Capacity Fees</u>: To support Capital Improvement Plans as included within the 2015 Water Master Plan it is necessary to update the Capacity Fee for new services to adjust for inflation. Based on the scheduled improvements to the distribution system necessary to support additional capacity and in order to insure the continued availability of physical facilities to serve the District's needs, it was recommended that the Board adopt Ordinance 2019-01— Amending Ordinance 96-1, Section 2, Plant Capacity Fees. The proposed increases are as follows:

3/4" Service \$ 16,429.00 1" Service \$ 27,378.00 1-1/2" Service \$ 54,767.00

The Board set a public hearing for April 17, 2019 at 7:00 pm at the District Office to receive comments on the proposed increases.



# Placer Road Water Line Repair

On February 28<sup>th</sup>, a service line leak quickly grew into a larger watermain leak on Placer Road just west of Boston Avenue. Considering its location, a considerable

traffic control effort was necessary to ensure a safe working environment for the first responders. As part of this repair, a small portion of the 8-inch watermain needed to be replaced due to it being damaged by the leak. Thank you for your patience during this repair.



# 24" Pipeline Along Placer Road



In March of 2018, the Board of Directors awarded the bid for the construction of a 24" Ductile Iron Pipeline along Placer Road to Sunrise Excavating. Due to the Carr Fire, as well as a very wet winter, this project has been postponed until weather permits. Please remember to slow for the "cone zone".



# History of Grant School . . .



In 1958, the two room Grant School located near Olney Park Drive had 68 students. They began to run out of room so it was decided to build a new school. The new school consisted of 4 rooms and was located at its present site.

In 1975-76 a multipurpose room and office were added along with a new cafeteria and two more classrooms. Almost immediately the school was too small so three portables were brought in. Through out these years Grant School has continued to grow and need additional space. The current attendance at Grant School is 637.

Fun Facts: The palm trees in front of Grant School's office were grown from seeds planted by Emma Larison (the teacher) around 1930 when the school was located across from Olney Park Drive. When the school was relocated, the trees were also moved. The bell outside the multipurpose room was originally at Centerville School. Traditionally the bell is rung one time for each graduating eight grader.

# Tips & Tricks For **Avoiding Late Fees**



<u>ONLINE ACCESS</u> - With On-Line Access you can easily review and pay your monthly bill. Payments can be made using a debit/credit card or e-check\*. You can also request services and sign up to receive our new paperless "E-Bill" or sign up for the "Auto-Pay" option.

\* Please note that all on-line payments are charged a transaction fee of \$3.00 or 3% (whichever is greater) by the payment processor for the third-party transaction.

Simply go to our website www.centervillecsd.org and click the large green Bill Payment button in the right hand corner of the screen. From here you click the red button titled Pay Your Bill Now. First time users will need to register their account. To register select the button titled (Not Already Registered? Register Now.). If you don't want to register your account, but want to make an online payment, choose the "Quick Pay" button. This allows you to make a debit/credit card or e-check payment online without registering an on-line account.

<u>AUTOMATIC PAYMENTS (ACH)</u> - This is the worry-free way to pay your water bill. With this service, you will continue to receive a monthly water bill (whether mailed or a paperless "E-Bill"); however, the amount due will be automatically deducted from your bank account. There is no set-up fee or charge associated with this payment method. To set up an Automatic Bank Draft, you can complete the ACH Auto-Pay Application form located on our webpage and return it to the District Office with a voided check or stop by the District Office and fill out the form. Make sure you bring in a voided check.
