What a great year it has been. Because of our wonderful community and everyone doing their part to conserve water, the District will be reporting an estimated 30% conservation to the state for the period from December 2015 thru November 2016. Although conservation was voluntary, you surpassed the 25% goal from the state and proved that together we can succeed. With the recent rains continuing to fill our reservoirs, there is hope for greater water supplies.

With 2016 being an election year, we were happy to retain Directors Eric Woodstrom and Walt Richison. If you have not met the individuals who are dedicated to serving the District, let me introduce them to you...

Two of our long term members Directors Larry Whitehead and Walt Richison were instrumental in securing 2,800 acre-feet of prescriptive water rights from the United States Bureau of Reclamation; and the purchase of 900 acre-feet of pre-1914 water rights. Those 900 acre-feet have proven to be priceless in recent droughts. Director Whitehead has been a Board Member for 35 years and Director Richison has been on the Board for 25 years. These two gentlemen are valued for both their continued vision of the District as well as their wisdom of year's past.

Director Eric Woodstrom has served on the Board for 10 years. Director Woodstrom is a Chief Banking Officer here in Redding. He brings his financial expertise to the table and is dedicated to the District's Financial and Capital Growth.

Director Don Newman has served the Centerville community not only as a Centerville CSD Board Member for the last six years but was also the Fire Chief of the Volunteer Fire Department for many years. Director Newman has a heart of service. He has volunteered in aiding several states during times of disaster such as hurricane Katrina. We are fortunate to have him on our Board.

Director Joy Willis is our newest member joining the Board of Directors in 2014. Director Willis served Shasta County for 20 years as both a Supervisor and Director of SHASCOM. She was instrumental in obtaining over \$2,000,000 in grant funding and bringing Emergency Medical Dispatching to Shasta County.
