It's always a surprise how quickly another year goes by. This year started off with exciting news of the drought being over. It was your commitment to reducing your usage during this period that enabled us all to use voluntary conservation measures during the three years of drought. So again, we thank you for your co-operation!

Highlights of 2017...

1995-1 Assessment and Texas Springs Assessment Bond Calls: This year the Board of Directors approved two bond call payments. The first was on the 1995-1 Assessment in the amount of \$176,633.34, and the second was on the Texas Springs Assessment in the amount of \$9,400.00. Along with the bond call, the District sent rebates to those individuals who had paid their 1995-1 Assessment in full. These Assessment Districts were necessary to improve and expand the District's distribution system back in 1995 and 2001.

<u>Meter Replacement Program</u>: As part of the District's conservation measures, the Board of Directors elected to replace all of the District's meters with new smart meter technology. It is the desire of the Board to have the entire District converted to smart meters by June 2020. The District has a total of 1,256 water customers. To date, the District has installed 517 smart meters throughout the District.

<u>As-Needed Construction Agreements:</u> The Board of Directors elected to enter into As-Needed Construction Agreements with three local contractors: RAS Construction, SnL Group, Inc. and Eddie Axner Construction. It wasn't long after the contracts were signed that the District had two main line breaks on Silver King Road. This stretch of asbestos cement pipe is over 50 years old. Due to the depth of the pipe and severity of the breaks, the District utilized Eddie Axner Construction to assist with the repairs.

<u>ADA Improvement Project</u>: The Board of Directors awarded the project to DC Construction to make accessible improvements to the Office Building. Construction began in October and will be complete by the end of 2017.

<u>Annual Coat Drive:</u> As this year comes to an end, we would like to thank you for another successful coat drive. Many coats, hats and scarves were received.
