Electricity	-	\$ 407.00
Cell Phone	-	\$ 75.00
Landline Phone	-	\$ 75.00
Satellite TV	-	\$ 130.00
Internet	-	\$ 50.00
Garbage	-	\$ 30.00
Water	-	\$ 88.00



The funny thing is, you can live without the Electricity, TV, Cell Phone, Landline and Internet.....but how long could you live without water?



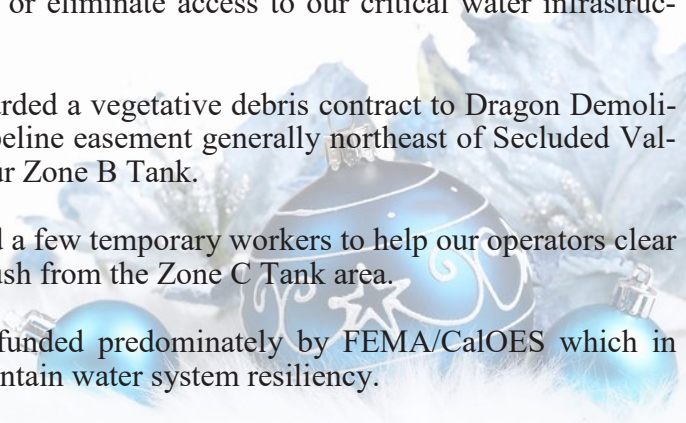
## *Brush Clearing Projects*

One thing we learned from the Carr and Zogg Fires is that over-grown manzanita and brush is not a good combination. Not only can it be a fire hazard, in some cases it can restrict or eliminate access to our critical water infrastructure.

Recently, the District awarded a vegetative debris contract to Dragon Demolition to clear the entire pipeline easement generally northeast of Secluded Valley to Prospect Road to our Zone B Tank.

The District has also hired a few temporary workers to help our operators clear debris and over grown brush from the Zone C Tank area.

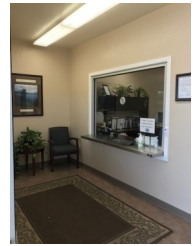
Both projects are being funded predominately by FEMA/CalOES which in turn helps the District maintain water system resiliency.





# Main Events of 2020!

Wow, what a year this has been. Centerville CSD began the construction of the new office lobby in December of 2019, not knowing that COVID-19 restrictions would be announced shortly thereafter. The new lobby was completed in February and has allowed our office to remain open to the public for most of the year.



Centerville CSD was awarded a \$10,000 grant this year, to purchase a Generac Generator for the District Office. With the PGE power shut-offs throughout the year, this generator has kept critical systems operational which helps our staff deliver a safe and reliable water supply to you. Thank you ACWA JPIA for awarding the grant for this much needed piece of equipment.

AC Pipe Testing. Earlier this year, operator staff removed whole sections of AC pipeline so that it could be tested by an expert consultant. Once completed, this study will provide useful information of the pipe's current condition as well as estimate its remaining useful lives. This will aid the District in making more informed decisions in maintaining and replacing those critical mainlines in the future.
