Avoid Frozen Pipes

If you haven't already done so..... It's that time of year to wrap all of your exposed water lines with insulation or heating tape (including hose bibs, pressure regulators, etc.). We also encourage you to locate your water meter and determine whether or not you have an individual shut off valve (gate valve) just behind your meter box. This could save valuable time and damage to your personal property should your pipes freeze and break.
