# Water Shortage Contingency Plan

**Adoption of the District's 2023 Water Shortage Contingency Plan:** The Board of Directors adopted a new Water Shortage Contingency Plan that includes the new drought requirements of Senate Bill (SB) 552.

The most significant requirement is that the plan must include a total of six drought stages. Additionally, SB 552 requires implementation of drought resilience measures that include continuous operation during power failures and meeting fire flow requirements subject to funding availability.

### **The six stages include:**

1. Year Round/Voluntary Water Conservation Measures
2. Moderate Water Shortage Conditions
3. Medium Water Shortage Conditions
4. Severe Water Shortage Conditions
5. Critical Water Shortage Conditions
6. Emergency Water Shortage Conditions

We would like to thank everyone for their conservation efforts during this last drought. Now that the drought is over, let's continue to work together to keep our landscapes clean and fire resistant.

# Tank Coating Program

The District is in its second year of a ten-year agreement with Superior Tank Solutions which includes a complete recoating, safety improvements and the complete maintenance of all water tanks (including full washout cleaning and inspections).

This past month Tank B was completely rehabilitated. The improvements include: OSHA safety upgrades, an additional roof vent, a complete interior and exterior recoating and a zinc primer for the unwetted interior areas.

Tank A also received minor repairs. In preparation of the multiday shut-down, field operators were able to manually pump water from Tank B to Tank A1 and bypass Tank A for repairs. While this process did require the operators to manually operate these pumps to maintain an adequate tank level, it also saved the District money since a temporary by-pass was not needed.



*Earthquake Warning California* is the country's first publicly available, statewide warning system that could give California residents crucial seconds to take cover before you feel shaking. Managed by the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), Earthquake Warning California uses ground motion sensors from across the state to detect earthquakes before humans can feel them and can notify Californians to "Drop, Cover and Hold On" in advance of an earthquake.

To receive earthquake warnings, individuals and family members can download the **MyShake** App.



**MyShake App:** The MyShake App sends a warning to mobile phone users that shaking is about to occur. Download yours today from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store.

Android Earthquake Alerts: Android phones with updated operating systems are automatically subscribed to Android Earthquake Alerts, which uses the same technology as the MyShake App; and

Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEAs): No-cost text messages for emergency situations [magnitude 5.0 or higher and Modified Mercalli Intensity IV (light) shaking].

If you live in or travel to areas that could be impacted by an earthquake, preparation is vital, as these events can strike suddenly, at any time, with little warning.
