Explore Your Water Source!

Whiskeytown Falls

Whiskeytown National Recreation Area invites you to discover the beauty of the park's stunning waterfalls. With three major cascades, each offering a unique experience, the park is a perfect destination for waterfall enthusiasts. Boulder Creek Falls, Whiskeytown Falls, and Crystal Creek Falls are open and ready for exploration.

Boulder Creek Falls

The three cascades of Boulder Creek Falls are tucked into a dark, shaded box canyon filled with moss and ferns. This cool respite is inviting after hiking uphill from South Shore Drive (2.7 miles one way, 1,000 feet elevation gain) or from the top of Mill Creek Rd (1.1 mile one way, 150 feet elevation gain).

Like much of the park, the forest around Boulder Creek Falls was selectively logged in the 1950s. As you hike to the falls, you are on hauling roads that carried old-growth Douglas fir and ponderosa pines to the sawmill. When the park was established in 1965, as part of the compromise, some logging was allowed to continue into the early 1970's.

Whiskeytown Falls

The tallest cascade in the park, Whiskeytown Falls is reached via a strenuous 1.7 mile hike (3.4 miles roundtrip) on the James K. Carr Trail. The trail follows some steep sections of old logging roads and climbs approximately 700 feet to the falls. Offering good exercise, shade, views through the mixed conifer forest, and a backcountry experience. The James K. Carr Trail to Whiskeytown Falls is the most popular trail in the park. At the base of the waterfall, be sure and carefully climb up the cement stairs to the upper viewing platform.

Crystal Creek Falls

The short 0.5 mile trail to Crystal Creek Falls is paved, flat, and accessible. The shallow natural pool at the base of the cascade is a popular spot for swimming and wading in the summer.

Whiskeytown National Recreation Area is more than just a place to hike; it's a place to connect with nature, recharge your batteries, and create unforgettable memories.

Dog Friendly

If you want to bring your dog with you, you'll be glad to know that unlike national parks the hiking trails in Whiskeytown National Recreation Area are dog-friendly. Please keep your dog on a leash and remember to clean up after them along the way.

Shasta LAFCO

Seeking Regular Public Member

What is LAFCO? It is the Local Agency Formation Commission that governs boundary lines between cities and special districts. It approves latent powers with and facilitates changes in local government structure. The LAFCO Commission is compiled of two county seats; two city seats; two special district seats and one public seat. Each of the entities also has 1 alternate seat. There are seven commissioners in total.

LAFCO is responsible for facilitating changes in local governmental structure and boundaries that foster orderly growth and development, promoting the efficient delivery of services, and encouraging the preservation of open space and agricultural lands. LAFCO meets these objectives by regulating the boundaries of cities and special districts and by conducting municipal service reviews and other special studies as needed.

The Shasta Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) invites interested persons to apply for the position of regular public member on the Commission. The regular public member fully participates in the discussion and deliberation at LAFCO meetings and votes on all items put before the Commission. LAFCO meetings are held at least six times per year on the first Thursday of even-numbered months at rotating public meeting locations in or near the City of Redding. The four-year term for the regular public member runs through December 31, 2029.

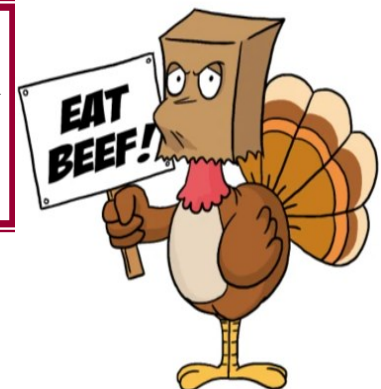
Requirements: Applicants must be residents of Shasta County, be able to regularly attend LAFCO meetings (held in Redding, Shasta Lake and Anderson), have a general understanding of LACO functions and authorities, and are not current officers or employees of a local public agency or a member of a public board, commission or committee that has the authority to make advisory or final decisions on matters relating to land use or the provisions of services.
