Tank Coating Program

District staff has been busy coordinating with Superior Tank Solutions, Bullert Electric, Rain-For-Rent and PACE Engineering in order to have everything ready to start the project.

The re-coating of the Zone A Tank will begin the first week of October. The project is estimated to take approximately two months and includes recoating of the interior and exterior as well as new OSHA safety improvements.
