Server Replacement Project

The Server Replacement Project was budgeted in the FY 23/24 Capital Budget. The current server dates back to 2012 and is approaching the end of its useful service life. Over the past few months, the server has been showing signs of its age which required additional computer support.

The Board of Directors unanimously awarded the District's Server Replacement Project to Computer Logistics of Redding. Continuing to upgrade and manage all District facilities ensures resiliency which enables the District to continually offer the best reliable water and customer service possible.



District Solicits Bids for the Telemetry Replacement Project

The Board of Directors voted to solicit bids for the Telemetry Replacement Project. This project will remove and replace the radios, antennas, surge protective devices and cabling at seven sites located throughout the District's service area.

At present, a large portion of the Telemetry System is over 20 years old. This system provides the critical communication network necessary to provide vital field information to the SCADA system so that the operators can monitor and remotely operate the distribution system. Having an estimated useful life of 15 - 20 years it is necessary to replace this equipment to ensure a seamless and resilient operation. The plans and specifications for the new telemetry were completed by PACE Engineering. Bid opening is scheduled for October 27, 2023.
