Don't Do The Right Thing the WRONG Way!

Whether working to create defensible space around your home, just mowing the lawn, pulling your dirt bike over to the side of the road or pulling the boat to the lake, you need to use all equipment safely and responsibly.

Wildfires have many causes of which we have control. The following are some useful tips:

Homeowners:

- Use string vegetation trimmers to cut tall grass.
- When cutting firewood or trimming trees, ensure chainsaws and other equipment have approved spark arrestors.
- Remove rocks from dry grass or weeds. Lawn mowers, weed-eaters and trimmers can all spark a wildfire.
- Cutting, welding and grinding: grind, sharpen and weld on paved enclosed areas.
- Be ready Have water and a fire extinguisher available as a precaution.

Vehicles:

- Practice safe towing.
- Never substitute parts when towing. Only use appropriate safety pins and hitch
- Make sure your vehicle is properly maintained, with nothing dragging on the around.
- Check your tire pressure. Driving on an exposed wheel rim throws sparks.

REPORT ALL FIRES! CALL 9-1-1

Report the location, what is burning and how fast the fire is moving. Let them know how tall the flames are and what is in danger of burning. Stop by the District Office for some informative handouts or visit www.PreventWildfireCA.org for additional information.





The 2016 National Public Lands Day will be held on Saturday, September 24th.
