Our Water

Having high quality, safe drinking water is important to us all.

To have great water, it helps to begin with a great source. Whiskeytown Lake was formed by construction of the Claire A. Hill Dam in 1963, as part of the Trinity River Division Project and Central Valley Project to minimize flooding, provide a source of irrigation and drinking water, and create recreational opportunities. The lake has a capacity of 241,100 acre-feet. Inflow to the reservoir is provided by two main sources: Clear Creek, which drains a majority of the watershed; and the Clear Creek Conduit, which conveys water from Lewiston Lake in Trinity County.

To ensure the best possible quality, the District tests the water in accordance to Federal and State regulations. The District regularly conducts routine tests throughout the District.

The District also makes seasonal operational changes, as well as, flushes dead-end lines to ensure that the highest quality drinking water is available to our customers. Dead-end flushing is just another method we use to guarantee delivery of the highest quality drinking water to your tap.

The District regularly conducts additional testing which includes: lead and copper, disinfection byproducts (TTHM & HAA5), asbestos, and those included in the U.S. EPA Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule program.
